
























HOUSE DAYS

VicSRC CONFERENCE

On Tuesday the 30th of May, Miss Duim and I took seven Year 5 students to a Student Voice and SRC Conference held by the VicSRC. This was a fantastic opportunity for the students to strengthen their skills as leaders and think about some areas of improvement within our school they would like to work towards.

They learnt all about the ALTER Model of Action, which stands for Ask, Listen, Think, Enact and Reflect. The students used this

model to develop some questions they can ask other students to gain an insight into the opinions of the rest of the school regarding the chosen issue.

We are all excited about taking the next step into the Listen stage of the model. At the end of the conference the organisers told us they were very impressed by the level of our students' thinking when setting their goal and their ideas around how they can get a stronger student voice within our school. This was extremely positive feedback as we were one of the only primary schools that attended the conference. Miss Duim and I are very proud of our students' ideas and the way they demonstrated our school values during this excursion, well done.

DIGITECH DAY

On Tuesday the 30th of May, 8 of the ICT leaders, Miss Adams and Millie, went to Deakin University in Waurn Ponds for DigiTech Day. We were 8 of 150 students who took part in a variety of workshops focusing on the digital technologies, schools in our area are using. Some of the workshops we went to were:

Design for 3D printing- where we created our own fidget spinners

'Robotics- where we competed against other schools and had to create specific code to get our robot across the finish line

Scratch- we played with the coding program called Scratch (free on the app store if you are interested!) **Makey makey makedo**- we loved playing with makey makedo like previous times, however this time we created consoles to use when playing games such as flappy bird.

Apple swift playground- here we got to work with people from Apple who showed us an advanced programing app for students. Here we met challenges we worked as a team and had to think and act like

a computer!

At the end of the day we all took part in the **Drones** workshop where we worked as a team and built a carrier for our drone to get it's cargo from one helipad to the other. Yet again we faced many different schools and we believe with 5 more minutes and one extra chance, we would of won the drone comp!

Yet again we had another very successful Digi Tech day full of new ideas to bring back to CSPS .

Swimming Lessons

As you will undoubtedly be aware the rates of drownings have continued to rise in recent years in Victoria and underlines the importance of swimming lessons.

Assembly presentation by 12A

Year 3 /4 classes have their swimming lessons starting in week 2 of term 3, from July 25th – Aug 3^{rd} . While Years Prep – 2 Swimming will run from September 12^{th} – 21^{st} .

As always, we endeavour to keep costs as reasonable as possible while keeping class sizes to appropriate levels. Swimming costs are based on busing, instructors and pool entry costs. We aim to keep the groups small and offer 8 x 45min lessons. As we live in a bayside environment and our town has numerous bodies of water big and small, it is even more important that our children can swim. Participating in swimming lessons not only provides crucial swimming skills, but also teaches students essential safety tips and areas of responsibility including: travelling on the bus to and from swimming, being responsible for getting themselves dry and dressed after class, being responsible for keeping track of their own clothes, participate in an event outside the school's regular classroom program and being resilient in challenging situations. Please note the permission notes are due back to school by Friday June 23rd with the payment to be finalised before swimming commences.

CSPS Camps Program

This year our **Year 3/4 students will be attending Sovereign Hill** to learn all about life in the diggings in the Victorian gold rush. The camp will be from September 20th – 22nd and will be in the last week of term 3.

Year 5/6 students will be attending Camp Wilkin in Anglesea which is a seaside and adventure camp. This camp focuses on teamwork, problem solving and lots of different adventure and seaside activities.

As always we like to give parents plenty of notice about this events so that they have time to save up for them. The year 5/6 camp will be run August 30^{th} – September 1^{st} .

I also take this opportunity to remind students and families that attending camp is a privilege and students attending camp are expected to be consistently displaying our values. <u>Please Note</u>: Deposits are now overdue for the camps so please finalise these as soon as possible. If you would are experiencing financial difficulty or would like to discuss payment options for camp please make and appointment with Mrs Nicholls and I to discuss.

Departmental Visitors

Last Wednesday morning we hosted some visitors from the Education Department's Professional Practice and Leadership division, along with The Literacy and Numeracy Secretariat. They were here to look at the way we use data and track growth or "impact". The Year 1/2 team were able to give them an insight into our Professional Learning Team/Community Meetings and talk about our mission to maximise growth for all students. Following the meeting, the teams spent some time answering questions before our visitors moved into discussions with myself around our work as a school and how our different focus areas fall within the Framework for Improving Student outcomes. As a result of this visit, we have been invited to work more closely with the Departments team, who are building case studies of schools working in the area of improving professional practice.

Friday, 28 Year 5/6 Last students went out to Ocean Grove to play soccer. Luckily, it was a nice day and no one got hurt.


We played games against Barwon heads, Ocean Grove, Drysdale and Surfside. Although we lost all of our games, we all had an awesome day.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE


O.S.H.C

UNIFORM FOR PREP STUDENTS

If you are;

- A prep parent &
- · Have a Health Care Card &
- Have applied for Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF),

you are also eligible for some school uniform supplied through State Schools Relief, (SSR).

State Schools Relief support families in providing school uniform for children and have an offer for eligible Prep and Year 7 students.

All eligible prep students can receive a pair of shoes, tracksuit pants and a top or jumper through SSR.

An application form will be sent home this week to families who have already qualified (ie received CSEF for 2017).

How to identify head lice

- Head lice can be anything from greyish white to white in colour
- They are the size of a sesame seed
- Nits are the eggs, yellowish white in colour and are found on the hair shaft generally at the nape of the neck
- Adult lice may be found anywhere on the head
- Red bite marks or scratch marks are often seen on the back of the neck
- The eggs are sometimes mistaken for dandruff
- It takes several weeks exposure to the lice before itching develops
- Remember:
- Head lice has nothing to do with hygiene
- ✓ Head lice don't like short and plaited hair
- ✓ The lice don't hop, jump or fly
- Don't share hats, head bands or pillows

How to control head lice

1 Detect

Use metal comb and combing solution to detect and remove head lice and their eggs

Treat

KP24 has different types of head lice treatments; the latest RAPID, medicated and natural treatments. Use either treatment to kill head lice and break their life cycle.

Prevent

Use egg remover and a metal comb to kill eggs and remove them from the head

Repeat

Repeat the process after 7 days to effectively kill the cycle

Clean

Wash bed linen and clothes in warm water with soaking solution to get rid of lice from home

The Commonwealth Government dental scheme provides eligible children with \$1000 free kids dental benefit on selected dental services within a 2 year calendar period.

- eligible for Medicare,
- between 2-17yrs for at least 1 day of the calendar year
- with the child or parent, guardian or carer receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A or another relevant government payment.
